Electives: either courses at the University of Lapland (as agreed in the personal study plan) or exchange studies from the programmes of network partner institutions.

Degree structure enables students to complete the required 25 – 30 credits /semester. Final year is dedicated mainly to thesis work and mobility to a partner institution. Students will be appointed a second supervisor for their thesis from the Network.

Joint component: A joint 30 credits component organised by Cape Breton University, UiT – the Arctic University of Norway, Umeå University, University of Iceland, University of Lapland, University of Oulu and Vancouver Island University, within/hosted by the University of the Arctic (UArctic) Thematic Network on Northern Tourism.

Through the involvement of the Thematic Network on Northern Tourism, the programme offers education based on research activities of the leading tourism scholars from Arctic areas. The joint component consist of a **field course and of two online courses.**
