



EUCEN Conferences

General Terms & Conditions

1. Registration fees

All participants must pay the registration fee prior to arrival at the conference venue. Participants are also advised to have a copy of their payment slip when going to the registration desk at the conference just in case they are requested to show proof of the payment on their arrival.

2. Cancellation Policy

Registration cancellations must be notified in writing by fax or email to the Conference Office at the University of Lapland, Rovaniemi-Lapland Congresses (fax: +358 (0)40 484 4461 or Email: congress@ulapland.fi).

Cancellations received 15 working days prior the first day of the conference (5 May 2010) will receive a refund of registration fees less an administration charge of 10% of the Conference fee. Cancellations made after, as well as 'no shows', are liable for the full registration fee.

Participants must make sure they receive an acknowledgement of their cancellation from Rovaniemi-Lapland Congresses. Only this will confirm that their request has been received and processed.

3. Liability

The EUCEN Conferences reserve the right to amend any part of the Conference programme if necessary at any time.

EUCEN will not accept liability for damages of any nature sustained by delegates or accompanying persons, or loss of, or damage to their personal property as a result of the Conference or related events.

In the event of industrial disruption or other unforeseen circumstances, EUCEN accepts no responsibility for loss of monies incurred by delegates.

Delegates should make their own arrangements with respect to personal insurance, along with travel insurance.

4. Personal Insurance

EUCEN cannot be responsible for healthcare, dental and ambulance services during its conferences. EUCEN strongly recommends that participants take out comprehensive medical and travel insurance, which should cover the possibility of flight cancellation due to strikes and other causes. Therefore, EUCEN and its local co-organisers accept no responsibility of any nature whatsoever for personal injury, death, loss or damage to property or participants however caused or arising.

5. Privacy Legislation
