The working group session will discuss examples of 'Resilience and Intelligence' within Contemporary Art practice and research. It will consider this in relation to the Cumulus Community, so extending the debate on current issues, practices and research shared live at the Cumulus conference.

The working group invites participation from individuals whose practice and/or research challenges notions of resilience, role, responsibility, and where ideas or acts of resistance within Contemporary Art can be shared and discussed within a globalised frame of reference.

## **Context**

The Cumulus Contemporary Art working group provides a unique opportunity for researchers and academics to work together across the disciplines of art and design.

The working group is a research platform for the exchange and generation of knowledge through the invited modes of participation, collaboration, inspiration and mentorship.

The agenda of the working group is set by the chair to ensure that the activities of the group are designed thematically to be aligned to Cumulus's main conference call for participation.

As a global network for contemporary art, it encourages new members to join, and conference attendees who would like to participate in order to expand the discourse in contemporary art and design theory, culture and practice. The group supports and promotes art and design education and research as a forum for partnership and the transfer of knowledge and best practices.

It is an arena for finding partners for academic and corporate project collaborations and developing relationships with colleges of art and design in other countries for the transfer of knowledge, research, and best practices.

The purpose of the Cumulus Contemporary Art Working Group is to encourage art in a more diverse culture and society, to rethink ideas and attitudes, and to challenge traditional boundaries in the rapidly changing cultural landscape of identity and values. Thus, contemporary art should be emphasized and considered, not as one of the directions within the conference working groups, but as a major base of points for all the innovative processes in design.
