

Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.)

Towards the Bachelor of Laws degree

- Studies in the Bachelor of Laws degree programme provide you with a comprehensive look to the legal order. They will also develop your ability to apply the acquired knowledge responsibly, competently and sustainably in terms of professional ethics in working life. On graduation you will be able to use and produce legal language in both writing and speech. You will also understand the international dimensions of legal operational environments.
- The degree is organised in twelve pools comprised of the compulsory basic and subject studies and the bachelor's thesis. Teaching in each pool is offered once a year. Compulsory courses are taken in periods of six or seven weeks, into which each term is divided. Language studies and elective courses are taken alongside the compulsory studies.
