Regulating Sustainability through Law and Innovation

The case of textile industry

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Description: The 'Regulating Sustainability through Law and Innovation: the case of the textile industry' seminar will discuss key legal, ethical and technical issues that technological innovation brings along to sustainability and sustainable development. The seminar will first present a general perspective to the relationship between law and sociotechnical change, as well as how IPR can enable sustainable innovation. Afterwards the seminar will provide a more detailed case-example in the form of the global textile and fashion industry.
